
ECO NEWS – ECO-COUNCIL 19/20

OCTOBER'S FOCUS IS MISSION MONTH – World Missions Ireland – Children Helping Children. As part of Mission month, we will be saying a decade of the Rosary with the pupils every Monday morning during October and would love if this tradition could be carried on at home. We would appreciate if pupils could bring Rosary beads with them every Monday. Each class in Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2 will compose their own Prayers and thoughts about children in need in other countries during this time.

BREAKFAST CLUB – Just a wee reminder that P1 pupils can join our Breakfast Club after Halloween - £1 per day – doors open at 8.30am!

ONLINE LEARNING – We are continuing this year with our Online Programme – Reading Eggs (P3-P7). All pupils will be provided with usernames and passwords. As well as incorporating these programmes into Literacy learning during the school day, K.S.1/2 pupils will be set tasks for homework each Thursday. Please monitor these tasks and if the pupils are experiencing difficulty accessing this programme at home, please forward a note to the class teacher. Alternative homework will be sent home for those who are having difficulty getting online at home.

MATHS WEEK – will take place from 14th – 18th October. During this week, the pupils will take part in lots of practical fun competitions and challenges based on our focus this year “Times-tables” and “Mental Arithmetic.” Also check out our school website where we have downloaded a very useful link – “Helping with Maths” in the parent zone section.

SWIMMING PROGRAMME – P6/7 will take part in an eight-week programme which will begin in January 2020 at a cost of £40 per pupil. We would appreciate if you would forward the cost either in monthly installments, or in one payment by Friday 6th December.

SCHOOL PHOTOGRAPHER – will be taking individual pupil photos on Tuesday 29th October as well as P1 and P7 class photographs. If you wish to have a family or group photo taken, please forward a note to the class teacher on the day. Pupils should wear their full school uniform on this day and bring their PE clothes if it is their PE day.

TIN WHISTLE-P3-P7 - A number of pupils are forgetting to bring their tin-whistle to school for the Friday lessons with Mrs Sweeney. We would appreciate if you would remind/check each Friday that pupils have their tin-whistle in their bag. These lessons are funded by parents and we don't want your money going to waste.

NUT/EGG ALLERGY – We currently have pupils in the school with both nut and egg allergies. Could I ask all parents to ensure that **NUTS IN ANY FORM** are not sent into the school for break or lunch. (Please check contents on lunch items). We can no longer accept cakes, treats, etc. being sent into the school for pupils' birthday celebrations. We would appreciate your support in this matter. Please also discuss with your child the reason behind **NOT SHARING** their break or lunch with other children. Sometimes this is difficult for the pupils to understand when we are usually trying to promote the ethos of sharing. Staff will also not be able to offer a break alternative to those who do not bring one to school – so please try and ensure that your child has a healthy break sent in in their schoolbag each day. It is a long period from morning until 12.30pm.

UPDATED CHILD PROTECTION POLICY – Please check our website for our updated Child Protection / Safeguarding Policy.

HOMEWORK MONITORING – Please continue to sign and check your child's Homework nightly and ensure corrections are completed – please also try and ensure your child sticks to a sensible bedtime each evening. The “yawning” during the school day is beginning to decrease but there are still a few who would benefit from an earlier bedtime to give them the best chance to learn during the school day. Please also try and ensure that your child uses the correct posture when working at a desk. i.e. feet together under the desk and elbows off the desk! If you have any queries regarding homework, please do not hesitate to contact the class teacher.

LUNCHES – We are once again appealing to you to ensure that your child brings a healthy lunch to school. A number of pupils' lunches are not reflecting a balanced diet and this is already having an impact on learning and behaviour in the afternoons. We would appreciate if ONE treat only was included in the lunch boxes and please keep monitoring whether your child is actually eating the healthy food you are providing.
