






### **BEDTIMES**


































# SEPTEMBER ACTIVE LEARNING IN P2/3

We have had a great start to the new year and Mr O'Hara has been very impressed with the primary 4s and 5s and the quality of work they have produced so far. During September we had great fun developing our problem solving skills using the IZAK 9 and the 6 Bricks resources. We used the IZAK 9 cube to work as a team and solve problems to find a hidden combination from a list of clues. This was a tricky task that needed us to work together and listen to each other to find the correct combination.

We used the 6 Bricks to develop firstly our listening skills as individuals. Mr O'Hara called out a list of instructions and what we had to follow. In the end we checked to see who had their towers built correctly. Next, we then got into groups and had to build the tallest tower. We had to plan and come up with a way to build the tallest tower that would not fall down and collapse. It was tricky finding a way to stop our towers from falling over but all the groups did a super job working as a team and problem solving their way to tall towers.

I am delighted that P6 and P7 are settling so well back into work!





We've been busy getting our Accelerated Reader up and running and we are all enjoying it so far! We're working at getting points to reach our targets! It's a great way to develop our reading skills!
































### MATHS WEEK

# DEVELOPMENT OF IRISH LANGUAGE / CULTURE

#### **ALLERGIES**

We currently have pupils in the school with both nut and egg allergies. Could I ask all parents to ensure that **NUTS IN ANY FORM** are not sent into the school for break or lunch. Please also try to ensure that your child uses the correct posture when working at a desk. i.e. feet together under the desk and elbows off the desk! If you have any queries regarding homework, please do not hesitate to contact the class teacher. Please ensure all written homework is completed by Friday. (It is not advisable to leave it all to Thursday night!) Please be aware that pupils will also have daily homework activities. e.g. reading, spellings, mental maths. (P1 & P2 will have words and sounds to go over each evening.) See weekly schedule.
